

OPPORTUNITIES FOR CBFN

CB FOR GRANTEES IS AND CAN BE EMBEDDED IN CBFN MEMBER PORTFOLIOS

FOCUS COLLECTIIVE CB ON GAPS AND NEEDS THAT WOULD BE UNMET OTHERWISE

SOME PROGRESS, BUT STRUGGLE TO DIVERSIFY BASE OF SUPPORT

BUILD ON MODEL OF TRUST, BUT FOCUS STRATEGIES ON CROSS SECTOR NETWORK BUILDING

CULTURAL CLASHES WITH NEW TACTICS, ORGANIZATIONS ARE SLOW TO CHANGE

NOT ALL GROUPS CAN/WILL DO ALL THINGS, "IT TAKES A VILLAGE" TO AFFECT LASTING CHANGE
