

EPA Urban Waters Activities


This Urban Waters locations map indicates places where EPA and federal, state and/or local partners are collaborating. Locations are displayed in layers representing:





Los Angeles Urban Waters Federal Partnership

Background: In 2011, John Kemmerer of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Los Angeles convened a core group of Los Angeles River and Watershed leaders to explore how the federal government could better coordinate and expedite local projects aligned with the vision of restoring natural function to the River and increasing green infrastructure benefits throughout its watershed. What began as a conversation among a dozen participants has evolved into a forum for coordination, integration, and exchange of ideas among a diverse set of stakeholders (EPA).
