



COST SHARE REQUIREMENTS

Cost Share:

Generally FEMA will pay 75% of the total cost.

PDM:

• FEMA will pay up to 90% for small, impoverished communities.

FMA:

- FEMA will pay up to 90% Federal Share for Repetitive Loss Properties.
- FEMA will pay up to 100% Federal Share for Severe Repetitive Loss Properties.

FMA ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

All Subapplicants must be NFIP participants in good standing (not suspended)


Individual properties must be NFIP-insured

Community Flood Mitigation Projects must demonstrate benefit to NFIP





FY18 FMA – FUNDING PRIORITIES



FY18 FMA COMMUNITY FLOOD MITIGATION

- A. Advance Assistance seed funding for community analysis and design of future community flood mitigation projects
 - \$100,000 Federal Share project cap
- **B.** Community Flood Mitigation Projects funding for projects that address flood risk on a community level.
 - \$10 million Federal Share Project cap

Prioritize Subapplications from communities who have demonstrated a commitment to reducing flood risk through enhanced flood regulations and enforcement of responsible development.

- Community Rating System (CRS) Participation
- Cooperating Technical Partners Program (CTP)
- International Building Codes (IBC)
- Building Code Effectiveness Grading Schedule (BCEGS)
- Private Partnership Cost Share

COMMUNITY FLOOD MITIGATION PROJECT TYPES

Eligible community flood mitigation projects

- Floodplain and stream restoration
- Floodwater storage and diversion
- Infrastructure protective measures
- Localized flood control to protect critical facility
- Aquifer storage and recovery
- Stormwater management
- Utility protective measures
- Water and sanitary sewer system protective measures
- Wetland restoration/creation

Part 80 voluntary acquisitions and elevations are ineligible





State/Territory allocation \$575,000

Tribal set aside \$575,000

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Advance Assistance (NEW FY18)

Development of community mitigation projects for future funding including:

- Full project scoping
- Developing mitigation strategies
- Obtaining data for prioritization & project selection
- \$25 Million Available
 - \$100,000 Federal Share Project Cap



Resilient Infrastructure Competitive Funding (NEW FY18)

Capital projects that provide mitigation on a community level

- 1 Subapplication per Applicant (State/Tribe)
- \$100 Million Available Total
 - \$10 Million Federal Share Project Cap



Resilient Infrastructure Projects

Can be all-hazard, to include flood, seismic, wind, wildfire, and drought:

- Infrastructure protective measures
- Utility protective measures
- Water and sanitary sewer system protective measures
- Localized flood control to protect critical facilities
- Floodwater storage and diversion
- Floodplain and stream restoration
- Stormwater management
- Aquifer storage and recovery
- Wetland restoration/creation

PDM COMPETITIVE FACTORS



FEMA will further prioritize the competitive subapplications as needed based on:

- 1. Public-private partnership participation inclusion of private funds in the non-federal share
- 2. International Building Codes (IBC) Adopted
- 3. Building Code Effectiveness Grading Schedule (BCEGS)
- 4. Community Rating System (CRS) Participation
- 5. Firewise Community
- 6. Cooperating Technical Partners Program (CTP)
- *BCR used as tiebreaker
